



# COM Library's Book Marks to Go!

COM LIBRARY, INFORMATION FOR LIFE...

## All 3 Options

- Requires creating an account
- Import existing bookmarks from your browser
- Access through browser toolbar or bookmarks page
- Search your bookmarks
- Label bookmarks(sort of like folders or tags)
- Two ways to add: on bookmarks page or using toolbar add-on (easiest)
- Add notes

### Yahoo (<http://us.bookmarks.yahoo.com/>)

- Can import from browser (<http://bookmarks.yahoo.com/tools/showimport>)
- Can add notes, tags, add to Quick List or save a copy
- Access Help (<http://help.yahoo.com/l/us/yahoo/bookmarks/>)

### Google (<http://www.google.com/bookmarks>)

- Import from browser from the Google toolbar bookmarks button
- RSS feed available so you or someone can subscribe

### Delicious (<http://delicious.com/>)

- Creating account quickest
- Import existing bookmarks from your browser
- Access through browser toolbar or bookmarks page
- Search your bookmarks
- Tag bookmarks
- Two ways to add: on bookmarks page or using toolbar add-on (easiest)
- Add notes
- Adding bookmarks quickest of 3
- Sharing
  - Easiest to share with others
  - You can search everyone's delicious bookmarks
  - You can subscribe to specific searches so when a new book is added on your topic, you'll find out about it

- You can add other bookmarks (like [comlibrarian's](#)) to your network and always have those bookmarks available to you as well as your own
- You or others can subscribe to your delicious feed or other delicious feeds
- Feeds can be to specific tags, like history or baseball
- Can sync to your Facebook page
- Can mark any bookmark as private so no one else sees it
- Install the add on to your browser to make adding easier (<http://delicious.com/help/tools>) OR, if you use Yahoo! Toolbar you can add delicious buttons to it
  - Check out Help (<http://delicious.com/help>) and What's New (<http://delicious.com/help/whatsnew>)

## Tips

- Probably best to pick one that suits you best and learn to use that one well
- COM Library computers have both Google and Yahoo! Toolbars installed so when you sign in to your account you can access your own bookmarks
